WHEREAS, complete documentation on the details of the proposed Agreement for Conditional Transfer of Property Pursuant to 1984 PA 425 Between the City of Lansing and Alaiedon Township is on file in the office of the City Clerk;

RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lansing that a public hearing be set for Monday, February 4, 2008, at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, Tenth Floor, Lansing City Hall, 124 West Michigan Avenue, Lansing, Michigan, for the purpose of receiving public comment on the proposed Agreement for Conditional Transfer of Property Pursuant to 1984 PA 425 Between the City of Lansing and Alaiedon Township.

Description of the Property to be Conditionally Transferred.

RESOLUTION#010

BY COMMITTEE ON INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS
RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LANSING

ACT-14-06, Groesbeck Drain Easement – Groesbeck Golf Course & Bancroft Park

WHEREAS, Patrick Lindemann, Ingham County Drain Commissioner, on behalf of the Groesbeck Park Drainage District, wishes to acquire easements over Bancroft Park and Groesbeck Golf Course for the continued use of the ponds for Drainage District purposes within both the Groesbeck Golf course and Bancroft Park; and

WHEREAS, the Drainage District serves portions of Bancroft Park and the Groesbeck Golf Course, as well as property reserved for Lansing Board of Water and Light (LBWL) purposes to the north; and

WHEREAS, this proposal is related to Act-4-07, two easements and a covenant deed for the use of LBWL property north of and adjacent to Bancroft Park and the Groesbeck Golf Course for the same drainage district, previously approved by City Council on January 14, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the subject easements over Groesbeck Golf Course and Bancroft Park are to allow the Ingham County Drain Commissioner to maintain the ponds as part of the Groesbeck Drain system, and consist of holding ponds, overflow pipe, grading, embankment, and restoration and mitigation activities; and

WHEREAS, the Drainage Easement is be for storm water and flood control, and the conveyance to and temporary storage of water within the detention areas, with such rights of entry upon, passage over and storing of equipment and material including excavated earth as may be necessary for the construction, maintenance and improvement of drain and detention areas; and

WHEREAS, the Access Roadway Easement will provide for an access road or route within Bancroft Park for ingress and egress to the easement area to be along the existing gravel access trail leading from the public parking lot to the overflow pond; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2006, the Lansing Park Board voted unanimously (8-0) to recommend approval of the proposed easements for the Groesbeck Drain; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2006, the Planning Board, voted unanimously (4-0) to recommend approval of Act-14-06, proposed easements for the Groesbeck Drain; and

WHEREAS, the Board found, based upon review of the location, character and extent of ACT-14-06 that:

- The easements themselves have no impact upon the City's sewer or street infrastructure.

- There would be an overall improvement to the environment as a result of the drain easement.
- There would be several positive amenities with the approval of the drain easement including:
 - The ponds are a part of the Groesbeck Park Drain storm water polishing system, which filter and cleanse storm water received through the drain district's storm water drains and eventually discharge to the Grand River in Old Town.
 - The Groesbeck Park Drain District would be responsible for the maintenance of both the Groesbeck Golf Course pond, located at the northern reach of the course and the Bancroft Park pond. The cost of maintenance would be spread to the overall drain district.
 - Improved drainage controls on both the golf course and park ponds.
 - A reduction of road flooding on Lake Lansing Road.
- The proposal will not impair the public's full enjoyment and use of Lansing's parkland.

WHEREAS, the District will compensate the City for these easements with \$970,000 in cash; and

WHEREAS, the District has agreed to certain remediation and mitigation activities, which will result in enhancements to the park and golf course and will the access pathway in Bancroft Park; and

WHEREAS the property will continue to be used for public park purposes; and

WHEREAS the City may elect at its option to contract with the District for additional improvements to the parks; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Intergovernmental Relations has considered and reviewed the report and recommendations of the Park Board and Planning Board, and concurs therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Lansing City Council hereby approves Act-14-06, and grants the following easements over Bancroft Park and the Groesbeck Golf Course, including access, to the Groesbeck Drainage District in exchange for \$970,000 in cash, plus park improvements as described above provided that the easement agreement is approved by the City Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the easements granted are over the following properties:

1. Easement Area A, Groesbeck Golf Course, David Street Control Structure, 50 foot Easement Description, described as:

A 50 foot wide easement that is part of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 3 and part of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 10 in Town 4 North, Range 2 West, Lansing Township and the City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan, described as; Commencing at the northeast corner of said Section 10 also being the southeast corner of said Section 3; thence S89°52'W 1204.0 feet along the section line between said sections to the intersection of said section line and a pond flood control structure and the POINT OF BEGINNING of this description; Said 50 foot wide description is 25 feet either side of the following described centerline; thence S 00°08'00" E a distance of 33.0 feet, more or less to the north bank of the Groesbeck Golf Course holding pond, the South Right-of-Way of David Street and the POINT OF ENDING, containing 0.03 acres, more or less. Said easement is intended to be contiguous to said north bank.

2. Easement Area B, Groesbeck Golf Course / Bancroft Park, Holding Pond Easement, described as:

An easement that is part of the Northeast ¼ of Section 10 in Town 4 North, Range 2 West, City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan, described as; Commencing at the northeast corner of said Section 10; thence S89°52'W 1196.25 feet along the north line of said section; thence S 00° 08' E 33.0 feet to the south right-of-way line of David Street and the north corner common to Lots 15 and 16 of Assessor's Plat No. 50 and the Point of Beginning of this description; thence along said right-of-way line N 89°52' E a distance of 123.75 feet to the northeast corner of said Lot 15; thence along the east line of said lot S 00°12' E a distance of 264.00 feet to the southeast corner of said lot also being the south line of said plat; thence along said line N 89°52' E a distance of 155.0 feet; thence S 00°12' E a distance of 520.0 feet; thence S 89°52' E a distance of 100.0 feet; thence S 00°12' E a distance of 405.0 feet; thence S 89°52' W a distance of 330.0 feet; thence N 00°12' W a distance of 100.0 feet; thence S 89°52' W a distance of 115.0 feet; thence N 00°12' W a distance of 600.0 feet; thence N 89°52' E a distance of 115.0 feet; thence N 00°12' W a distance of 225.0 feet; thence N 89°52' E a distance of 27.5 feet to the southwest corner of Lot 16 of said plat also being the south line of said plat; thence along the west line of said lot, N 00°12' W a distance of 264.0 feet to the northwest corner of said lot and also the south right-of-way line of David Street; thence N 89°52' E a distance of 123.75 feet; to the north corner common to Lots 15 and 16 and the Point of Beginning, containing 11.285 acres, more or less.

3. Easement Area C, Groesbeck Golf Course / Bancroft Park, 60 foot Easement for Overflow Pipe

A 60 foot wide drainage easement that is part of the Northeast ¼ of Section 10 in Town 4 North, Range 2 West, City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan, described as; Commencing at the northeast corner of said Section 10; thence S89°52'W 1385.50 feet along the north line of said section to a point on said section line; thence S 00° 08' E 681.0 feet to the centerline of the east end of this description, the west side of the Groesbeck Golf Course Holding Pond and the POINT OF BEGINNING of this description. Said 60 foot wide description is 30 feet either side of the following described centerline; thence N 80°00'00" W a distance of 220.0 feet to the east bank of the Overflow Pond and the POINT OF ENDING containing 0.303 acres, more or less. Said easement's northerly and southerly lines are intended to extend from the Holding Pond's waters edge to the Overflow Pond's waters edge.

4. Easement Area D, Groesbeck Golf Course / Bancroft Park, Overflow Pond and Embankment Easement, described as:

An easement that is part of the Northeast ¼ of Section 10 in Town 4 North, Range 2 West, City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan, described as; Commencing at the northeast corner of said Section 10; thence S89°52'W 1595.0 feet along the north line of said section to a point on said section line; thence S 00°08' E 341.0 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING of this description; thence continuing S 00°08' E a distance of 372.0 feet; thence S 89°52' W a distance of 190.0 feet; thence N 00°08' W a distance of 130.0 feet; thence S 89°52' W a distance of 80.0 feet; thence N 00°08' W a distance of 242.0 feet; thence N 89°52' E a distance of 270.0 feet to the Point of Beginning, containing 2.067 acres, more or less

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proceeds from this transaction are reserved for the payment of the City's Groesbeck Park Drainage District assessment and for additional improvements to Bancroft Park and Groesbeck Golf Course.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City may at its option contract with the Groesbeck Park Drainage District or Ingham County Drain Commissioner for additional park improvements; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Lansing, is hereby authorized to sign and execute all documents necessary to effectuate the above-stated transactions, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney.
